SHANTI THAKUR PRODUCER, DIRECTOR, WRITER, EDITOR

Shanti Thakur's visually poetic films have screened at over 200 international film festivals and museums including the Cannes Film Festival, Montreal World Film Festival, Edinburgh Film Festival, and the Museum of Modern Art in New York. Thakur's short fiction film SKY PEOPLE was considered for an Academy Award nomination. Crossing various genres, RED TULIPS, A STORY ABOUT FORGETTING, SKY PEOPLE, KAIROS, SEVEN HOURS TO BURN, TWO FORMS, CIRCLES and DOMINO have won 25 awards and have broadcast in 22 countries.

Working as director, writer, editor and producer on her films, Thakur has received support from the National Film Board of Canada, the Pennsylvania Council of the Arts, the Independent Film Project (IFP) and the Pew Fellowship in the Arts. She is Associate Professor in Film and Media Production at Hunter College, City University of New York. She lives in Brooklyn, New York.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

In my last film SEVEN HOURS TO BURN, I sieved 50 years of family history, 2 different wars, on 3 different continents in 9 minutes. I loved playing with time in the poetic way which only film can do.

Be it documentary or narrative, I'm intrigued by how characters are defined by specific moments in their lives. Turning points aren't always epic historic moments; our lives are as deeply affected by quiet moments next to a lover, a friend, sometimes, even a stranger.

I was intrigued with the Greek idea of "kairos", the precise moment when a new meaning is formed; the subjective experience of time. It's the instant of realizing you're in love, the "aha" of writing a song. The transformative moment. I took this idea of the "kairotic moment" and expanded it to 16 minutes. In that moment, Kari's hopes and desires for two contradictory men race through her head. Between 4:07 and 4:08, her choice isn't based on a "right" or a "wrong". The truth she creates is the one she's ready for.

His first recording as a leader Ritualism (2001) has received international critical appraise and was nominated for Debut CD of the Year by the Jazz Journalists Association.
